SWIMMING POOL RULES

- 1. Smoking or vaping of any kind is strictly prohibited in any area of the Pool.
- 2. The use of cell phones for audio calls is allowed only in the men's and women's changing rooms and designated areas by the back fence of the Large Pool area.
- 3. Guests, including children of all ages must be registered at the front desk at the pool area entrance before using the facilities. All children's pool parties must be arranged in advance through the General Manager's office.
- 4. For purposes of safety and identification, all non-family childcare attendants must be registered with the pool director. Members are required to acquaint their helpers with the Club rules.
- 5. The pool will officially open Memorial Day Weekend and stay open through Labor Day Weekend. There will be no access to or usage of the pool or pool area when the pool is officially closed. The playground is open year-round.
- 6. The pool director's decision in all matters relating to the safety and conduct of those in the pool area is final. In cases of dangerous weather, the pool director and staff will request immediate clearing of the pools and the pool areas.
- 7. Eyeglasses will not be allowed in the pool unless they are shatterproof.
- 8. No glass containers shall be allowed in the pool area. Members must place all garbage in the receptacles and return trays and utensils to the snack bar.
- 9. A hot soap shower or bath without bathing suit must be taken at the Club before entering the pool. If suntan lotion is used, please shower or bathe again before entering the pool.
- 10. Members are encouraged to conserve towel usage, and to place soiled towels in the baskets provided in various areas. Pool towels are not to be removed from the pool area.
- 11. Swimmers have priority in the lap lane.
- 12. All deck diving is restricted to the deep end of the pool only. A "NO DIVING" sign is posted at the shallow end of the pool.
- 13. No ball playing of any kind around the pool area unless supervised play with the pool staff, or approved games in the pool (i.e. the provided basketball and net). If the pool staff determines the pool is too crowded for basketball to be played safely, they will remove the basketballs and/or other toys from the pool for safety. Members may play ball in the field outside the pool area.
- 14. Tipping of the pool staff and counselors is not allowed.

Rules for Children at the Large Pool

- 1. All children under 10 must have a swimming evaluation which will be administered by the pool director. Any person who is unable to swim shall use the pool only when accompanied by an adult who swims.
- 2. All children may use the Large Pool during swim instruction with the pool director at any time.
- 3. Children must be at least 2 years old AND toilet trained to use the Large Pool and the area around the Large Pool. The snack bar and eating areas are open to everyone with appropriate supervision.
- 4. Children under 2 years old OR children who are not toilet trained are NOT allowed to use the Large Pool at any time.
- 5. Children under the age of 9 may use the pool only when an adult who swims is in the area. Non-family childcare attendants may use the pool weekdays, only while member's children are in their care.
- 6. Sitting on the snack bar counter is not permitted.
- 7. Strollers and any other childcare equipment with wheels are prohibited in the Large Pool area. Strollers are permitted in the little pool area but may not otherwise be used except to transport children from Club parking areas.

Rules for Children at the Little Pool

- 1. Children under 3 must be accompanied by an adult member or a non-family childcare attendant at all times. The non-family childcare attendant must remain in the pool area.
- 2. Children over 3 may be left with the pool counselors for a period not to exceed three hours. The member parent or grandparent must sign out with the counselor on duty, indicate where on Club premises he/she can be found, and must remain on the Club premises. If the number of children already in the care of the counselor is large, the counselor will suggest that the member remain in the pool area until the group is smaller. That suggestion must be honored. Counselors are never permitted to attend to children outside of the counselor area.
- 3. Diaper changing and changing of bathing suits must be done in the pool locker rooms. The changing room is provided for such purposes and should be kept clean by those using it.
- 4. A swim diaper or snug fitting rubber pants must be worn in the baby pool for the safety and comfort of the child. Regular diapers are not allowed in the pool at any time. They are designed to absorb water and can become dangerously heavy.
- 5. Children over 6 are not permitted to use the little pool.

Parents are urged to use special care at all times to ensure a safe pool and playground environment. The lifeguards are responsible for the safety of all persons in the pool areas; however, parents are responsible for the supervision of their children, regardless of age
